Cyren Call Welcomes Selection as Public Safety Advisor

McLean, Va. – October 5, 2007 – Today, the Public Safety Spectrum Trust Corporation (PSST) announced the appointment of Cyren Call Communications Corporation as its advisor following an open competition. As a result of the PSST's decision, Cyren Call will serve as the primary liaison between the PSST and the commercial sector, including all parties interested in potentially bidding for the upper 700 MHz D Block license to partner with Public Safety in the creation of a nationwide, wireless broadband network.

Morgan O'Brien, Chairman of Cyren Call, said, "After nearly two years of hard work, Cyren Call is honored to serve in the capacity as advisor to the PSST, exactly where we had hoped to be. Creating this first of its kind network for Public Safety will be a challenging task, but one in which we are privileged to play an important role for both Public Safety and the good of the American public."

O'Brien added, "Our first goal will be to create a better understanding and appreciation of the tremendous business opportunity for the commercial sector to partner with Public Safety. However, with the auction to begin in January, time is of the essence and we encourage anyone interested in the D block to contact Cyren Call to discuss the merits of building this shared network. Between now and release of the PSST's Statement of Requirements, we'd like to collect the thoughts and ideas of all interested bidding parties pertaining to the public safety network requirements. A healthy and robust auction will result from potential bidders gaining a clearer understanding of what will be entailed in building, operating and maintaining this shared network to standards that will meet Public Safety's expressed needs."

O'Brien further commented, "Special recognition must be given to the FCC and its five Commissioners. Without their action and leadership, the creation of this network would not be moving from concept to reality."

In July 2007, the FCC adopted a decision to add the creation a nationwide, wireless broadband network for shared Public Safety and commercial use to the new plan for spectrum at 700 MHz. As part of the 700 MHz decision, the winner of the upper 700 MHz D Block license would combine this asset with an additional 10 MHz of spectrum provided to a national Public Safety Broadband Licensee (PSBL), creating a public-private partnership where, in exchange for constructing the shared network to Public Safety specifications, the D Block commercial licensee would gain access to use the spectrum licensed to the PSBL to provide non-priority wireless broadband services to commercial subscribers. Key components of the FCC's decision mirror elements originally proposed by Cyren Call, including: the creation of a public-private partnership that harnesses commercial resources to benefit Public Safety; the creation of a national Public Safety licensee to control Public Safety spectrum assets and oversee the construction and operation of a nationwide wireless broadband network meeting Public Safety's critical communications needs in important areas such as network coverage, availability and reliability; and assuring that Public Safety users automatically would receive priority access rights on the network.
